Cell Notes – 27th May 2018 I am the way, and the truth, and the life

Our main passage this week is John 14:1-14, but first read John 13:33-38.

What is the context set by John 13? Why is Jesus saying what we read in John 14 to his disciples at this point in time?

For me the end of John 13 is Jesus leave-taking. He is going and they cannot come with him. Have you ever been in a truly awesome team, or friendship group, and been there at the point when you realise it is about to disband? Or when an awe inspiring leader is about to move on? Well like that - but worse!

And it is into that devastation, that emptiness that Jesus speaks the words of John 14. Read them now.

These words are words of comfort and assurance. Spoken to the emotionally devastated, to the lost, to the disappointed, to the confused, the distressed, those feeling helpless in themselves. And the message can be summed up in two words - TRUST ME - said 5 or 6 different ways, but the same message. How many ways do you see Jesus saying 'TRUST ME' in the passage.

Is there anything in this passage for you? Any way in which you are a bit like the disciples at the end of Ch 13 - if so is there any comfort in any of the promises of Jesus' assurances that you can trust him:

You're never adrift and homeless - there is a place for you.

You're never lost - there is a way.

You're not alone - the Father is close by.

You're never without help - Jesus is still powerful.
