The Sermon by Roy Lewis. The King's offer. Isaiah 55:6-13, Matthew 7:7-12.

Isaiah urges us to "Seek the Lord...call on Him while He is near.....forsake evil ways......Turn to the Lord".

Matthew engages in a similar way calling us to "Ask of God; to seek Him, and to knock at His door" - then discover His generous response.

We are encouraged to ask of God and receive from Him; to discover the joy of receiving good things from Him for those who ask Him.

Ask and receive! So often we have done this, and God has wonderfully responded to us then we return to Him with our thanks for hearing us and answering our prayers. Hallelujah!

BUT – and this is a serious question: have you always received from God what you asked Him for? Are there times when it appears God has not heard you, or if He has, then He has not granted your request, although here it suggests He would?

Have you, like me prayed for family, friends, fellow parishioners who have become seriously ill – BUT, it seems God has not answered our prayers?

How I have struggled with these words of Jesus, when I've really believed He, the loving Lord WOULD hear me and give what I asked for; did He really let me down?

This is a serious question, to which there must be an answer.

I think that over the years I have missed something here; Matthew in the Beatitudes repeatedly uses the word, Blessed. You will find many suggestions as to the meaning of this word in the Bible. Over 50 years ago I spent a year at Bible School, and I recall our Principal telling us it means "Oh the happiness of!" Today people talk about their "Happy Place!" Maybe Jesus is saying here that if we live the life He calls us to live – however hard it may be, we will find that continuing Happy Place of being Blessed by Him.

In this discourse which Jesus spoke while He sat outdoors, he uses another word, even more frequently than Blessed. It is Father, or more accurately Your Father. He actually uses this 15 times while blessed is used only nine times in the Sermon on the Mount.

He is talking about the disciples discovering that not only was God the Father of Jesus, but also of those who were His followers.

As I have been preparing to write this summary I realised that Matthew 7 is not a shopping list of the things we want; it is a process by which we come to know God more fully and discover the reality that God is the Father of all who believe in Him and in His Son, Jesus Christ.

We ask of Him - our Father; we seek Him, and we knock on His door. A process of Faith in which we are not merely asking for things, but we are coming to know God for ourselves: "MY Father!"

Jesus then talked about human parenting, and knowing how to give good gifts to our children; not simply giving them what they ask for, but giving them good things – the best.

So much more with God.

We come to Him; we ask of Him; we continue and knock at His door, knowing He is our Father; He loves us. He will give to us what He knows we need and what will be in our best interest.

It is not asking God for what we would like Him to give to us, but coming to know Him, trust Him and realise that He, as our heavenly Father will give to us what He knows we need, and will be for our good. **Prayers:** Rejoice in the Lord always. I will say it again: rejoice! Let your gentleness be evident to all. The Lord is near. Do not be anxious about anything, but in every situation, by prayer and petition, with thanksgiving, present your requests to God. (Philippians 4:4-6)
