Read Ephesians 2:1-10. Matthew 5:38 – 6:4: Responding Gracefully

Last week we started our series on Vision and Values, considering why we exist as a church and why do we do what we do, the answer is, we are, <u>Responding to God's love</u>. This week we look at our value of being a people of grace – in other words we respond to God's love gracefully.

God has demonstrated 'amazing grace.' Grace is defined as lovingkindness, as unmerited favour, or as in the mnemonic:

<u>G</u>od's <u>R</u>iches <u>At</u> <u>C</u>hrist's <u>E</u>xpense.

We spoke last week about the grace of God as we shared together the extent of love that God lavishes upon us that he would come in Jesus and die for us to restore us to relationship with him. And the bible speaks extensively about God's grace. See among many others: Romans 5:15; John 1:16 and Hebrews 4:16.

We must receive this grace, which is a free gift, in order to receive the love and life God offers both now and eternally. And human gifts of value make a difference to us, how much more a gift of this magnitude!

We are to live gracefully. In our Matthew 5 reading we are challenged to love our enemies, 'that we may be children of your Father in heaven' and to even 'Be perfect, therefore, as your heavenly Father is perfect.' Earlier in the same chapter we can read how 'Blessed are the peacemakers for they will be called children of God' (5:9). In response to God's love we are to be like God! We are to live graciously toward others, and in doing so, we take on the family likeness and join in the family business.

We are to love neighbour, friend and even enemy. Bearing unforgiveness and remaining bitter towards others is toxic to us. It is not in any way gracefull. It is ugly and damaging to all our relationships, especially with God! Read 1 John 4:7-8 and Leviticus 19:18.

Receiving God's grace toward us must make a difference. In the parable of the unforgiving servant (Matthew 18:21-35) a servant is forgiven a huge and unpayable debt. Yet this servant fails to recognise the grace received, he doesn't celebrate his freedom and invite others to share his joy, instead he demands that a colleague who owes him a few pennies pays up, and when the colleague can't he sends him to jail. The unforgiving servant is judged severely for his failure to receive and share forgiveness. We must receive the grace of God to enter freedom and life, and we must share that same grace with others.

Unforgiveness and bitterness is ugly, love is graceful. Read 1 Corinthians 13:1-7.

<u>We are to live generously</u>. God is generous to us and in our Matthew reading we are encouraged to be generous to all. Do we live with a willingness to share or do we cling on to what we have? Possessions possess us if we are unable to share. Winston Churchill said, *'We make a living by what we get. We make a life by what we give.'* Paul reminds us that God loves a cheerful giver (2 Corinthians 9:7).

We are challenged to share our 'stuff', our money, our time, and skills, even with our enemy, with a willingness to go the extra mile.

<u>We are to live humbly.</u> Our Matthew passage reminds us seek God's favour, i.e. grace and not do good deeds for show to live humbly (See Matthew 6:1 and read Philippians 2:3-4).

Live graciously and demonstrate the Kingdom. In our Ephesians reading we can see that we are visual aids, demonstrating the grace of God to the world and coming ages (v.7). And, we are created for 'good works' (v.10) including, of course, to love generously!

We live in response to God's love, his amazing grace. And so we are to live gracefully, living lovingly, generously, humbly as children of God. 2 Timothy 2:1 'Timothy, my dear son, be strong through the grace that God gives you in Christ Jesus.' **Prayers:** Rejoice in the Lord always. I will say it again: rejoice! Let your gentleness be evident to all. The Lord is near. Do not be anxious about anything, but in every situation, by prayer and petition, with thanksgiving, present your requests to God. (Philippians 4:4-6)

- Pray for this day, and the coming week.
- Pray for justice, mercy, peace, and hope.
- Pray for individuals, neighbours, and for family & friends.



• Pray for the Church.

Collect: Second Sunday after Epiphany. Eternal Father, who at the baptism of Jesus revealed him to be your Son, anointing him with the Holy Spirit: grant to us, who are born again by water and the Spirit, that we may be faithful to our calling as your adopted children; through Jesus Christ your Son our Lord, who is alive and reigns with you, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, one God, now and for ever. **Amen.**

The Lord's Prayer: Almighty God, in Christ you make all things new: transform the poverty of our nature by the riches of your grace, and in the renewal of our lives make known your heavenly glory; through Jesus Christ your Son our Lord, who is alive and reigns with you, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, one God, now and for ever. **Amen.**
