Small Group Notes – 5 January 2020 – Gifted – What Can I Give Him?

We begin a new series, Gifted. It's an opportunity to be encouraged in identifying, seeking and developing God's gifts to us.

We are all have the same goal, to glorify God as we participate in the Kingdom of God, bringing Good News to the whole of creation, but we all have different roles to play. From front of house to the backroom, from administrators to service staff, receptionists, artists and embroiders! No-one is excluded, we can all be participants, we are all chosen. We are ministers as we take on the family likeness and join in the family business.

• What comes to our minds when we think about gifts, talents, abilities, and resources that God has gifted us with?

Read Matthew 2:1-12

In this story the Magi play their part (see the lyrics of 'In the Bleak Mid-Winter') along with the other participants.

They were focussed in fulfilling their role of finding the King and worshipping him and were willing to make personal sacrifices in the achievement of their task. There were things they had left, things they had stopped doing, new things they had had to take up, in order to take their proper place in this Kingdom story. Upon seeing the star, they were overjoyed (what a great word) and they gave their extravagant gifts and worshipped.

As we enter this New Year:

- What or where might we be being called towards?
 - Think about the things that inspire you or stir your heart. Think about the things that energise you. Pray, asking God to give you his heart for what he has for you.
- What might we be called to let go of? Think about the things that hold you back. These might be emotions, including fear, or they might be things or habits to which we are attached.
- What can we already celebrate? Many things are already given in service to Jesus and his Kingdom. Reflect on and celebrate these (be overjoyed), acknowledging God's grace in them?
- What might we give this year?
 These might include time, money, energy, or they might be specific skills. How might we use these things to serve God's Kingdom?
