Procedures during Services

The Church of England has updated its advice to those attending services and taking communion. We continue to offer communion in both kinds but, as always, if you are feeling unwell or have a slight infection, cold, cough etc it is sensible to avoid physical contact with anyone during a service, including at the sharing of the Peace, and during communion you may opt to receive the bread alone. For those taking communion, C of E advice discourages the dipping of the wafer in the wine (intinction). To reduce the risk of cross-infection those assisting with communion will clean their hands in an alcohol-based wash.



Unusually for a Lutheran composer, his Mass in B Minor was based on the Roman Catholic liturgy, and written in Latin, but it remains one of the finest, if not <u>the</u> finest, choral works ever written.

v10 Rejection – The Parable of the Sower teaches that the Gospel seed will bounce off some people hearts: 'the message of the cross is foolishness' to those not saved (1 Corinthians 1:18); counter to this Paul says:

...I am not ashamed of the gospel, because it is the power of God that brings salvation to everyone who believes...(Romans 1:16)

Consider and reflect; are you:

Reactive – Ready to give an answer to the hope you have in Christ Jesus?

Proactive – Do you join organisations like CAP that offer the Gospel while helping improve the circumstances of others?

Purposeful – By fostering acquaintances and friends outside the church family?

Small Group Notes – 8th March 2020 | Gifted – Sent Out

Please read and review Luke 10:1-11: a model of evangelism

Jesus says 'I will build my Church' (Matthew 16:18) – therefore, we, the Body of Christ are not responsible for 'converting' people but are commanded to deliver a message of hope (Matthew 28:19). The word 'evangelist' simply means 'bringer of good news'. We are not required to argue, cajole or persuade, simply 'tell'.

Luke uniquely records Jesus' commissioning seventy 'others' (the number 70 accords with elders of Israel Exodus 24:1 mirrored by the High Sanhedrin, the Jewish Authorities):

10:1-2 Jesus uses his metaphor for evangelism, harvesting (also John 4:34-38)

v3a Go – the disciples are paired and sent out – where two or three are gathered in Jesus' name, he will be also (Matthew 18:20). Companionship is recommended.

v3b Be careful – Jesus does not expect us to take unnecessary risks.

v4a Be faithful – we need no gimmick, slick presentation or fancy props. The Gospel of Christ (1 Corinthians 15:3-8) is ample. It is up to the Holy Spirit to reveal the truth concerning Jesus (Acts 16:14).

v4b Be focussed – do not be side-tracked but 'always be prepared to give an answer to everyone who asks you to give the reason for the hope that you have (in Jesus), but do this with gentleness and respect,' (1 Peter 3:15)

v5-6 Extend a blessing – pray with and for people; a simple prayer will suffice: 'May God grant you/your family His peace.'

v7a Be content – focus on the one receptive person that God places in front of you; mindful of the rejoicing in heaven over <u>one</u> lost sheep (Luke 15:7) i.e. the celebration is always individual and not magnified for 100s or 1000s who are found.

v7b Receive your due – doing God's work is commanded, but God will reward us (1 Corinthians 3:9-14)

v8 Be flexible – accept people how they present themselves – regarding 'no one from a worldly point of view' (2 Corinthians 5:16)

v9a Bring healing – from the Old English halp 'health' comes also 'hale', which gives us 'whole' and 'holy'. Without Jesus all are spiritually dead. The message of the Gospel is life and the evangelist brings healing, wholeness and holiness.

v9b Keep our message simple and words few; active and patient listening is itself a blessing.
